

Roles and responsibilities of the local PQIP team

BENEFITS OF BEING A LOCAL PQIP TEAM LEAD

- Named as collaborator in every annual report
- Named as collaborator in every research publication
- Named as local lead on PQIP website
- Opportunity to attend free national collaborative events

AVAILABLE LOCAL ROLES

Local principle investigator (will be one of either the anaesthesia lead, surgery lead or improvement lead)

Should ideally have GCP training

Responsible for:

- principle contact between hospital and PQIP central team
- supporting R&D approvals process locally
- overseeing patient recruitment and data quality and completeness, including
- dissemination of PQIP quarterly reports to surgical, anaesthesia, nursing and management colleagues.

Anaesthesia and Surgery clinical leads

Each hospital may require several leads for different types of surgery

Responsible for:

- working with the other clinical, management and improvement leads to disseminate PQIP findings and improvement opportunities
- communicating improvement opportunities to stakeholder group (i.e. anaesthesia or surgery).

Management leads

Responsible for:

- regular review of PQIP findings and supporting surgery, anaesthesia and improvement leads in dissemination
- reporting to senior management within hospital and Trust
- working with PI and clinical leads to ensure sufficient resources available to support local data collection, use and dissemination.

Improvement leads

Committed to developing own and others' skills and knowledge in improvement methods (e.g. use of run charts, statistical process control etc.)

Responsible for:

- supporting and leading colleagues in the use of PQIP data for local improvement
- dissemination of PQIP newsletters, reports and results to local teams.
